When operating in tight spaces, articulated boom lifts are more available as opposed to stick booms, specially if the application needs clearing nearby obstacles.

This machinery allows the fruit picker or worker to locate and pick fruits which are high in the trees. Similar equipment is used by telephone and cable companies and electrical providers who do installation and maintenance on utility poles.
